Shreelatha, Principal & Academic Director VET BVL Polytechnic spoke about the theme of International Day Against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking 2020, Better Knowledge for Better Care emphasizes the need to improve the understanding of the world drug problem and how better knowledge will foster greater international cooperation for countering its impact on health, governance and security.

Dr. R. Parvathi, Principal & Academic Director Vasavi educational trust described about why the day is dedicated to eradicating drug abuse and neutralize the systemic challenges which sustain the illegal drug issues around the world and also highlighted on the difference between life saving drug and life harming drugs. Especially for younger generation students.

Resource person Sub inspector Yogesh kargoda briefed about the criminal proceedings against possession of drugs under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act and the factor determining the quantum of punishment is not purported personal or commercial use, but the drug's quantity found with a person.

And also detailed about imprisonment for up to a year in case of some drugs and six months for some others. But addicts volunteering for treatment get immunity under Section 64-A of the Act.

He briefed about students should carefulness about the addictions of this drugs.

Resource person Sub inspector Yogesh kargoda concluded his words saying "Drugs are the enemies of ambition and hope and when we fight against drugs we are fighting for the future




Many students had participated in debate and shared their thoughts on far and against and finally concluded with saving Royal Bengal Tigers from getting extinct.





### COVID - 19 Testing camp Report

The VET First Grade college as an IQAC initiative and as part of Health Committee of the college initiated the COVID 19 testing camp for the staff of the college in view of the rising cases of the Pandemic. This camp was conducted in association with the Health wing of the BBMP. This is the first offline programme at VET First Grade College in the light of the existing continuing Pandemic

In view of fast spread of the virus and in view to ensure safety and security of all staff and students, this drive was conducted. The college has taken all necessary precautions and SOP - Standard Operating Procedures when it was reopened after the lockdown. The precautions taken include the thermal scanning at the entrance and in view of the pandemic, only the main entrance is been kept open, sanitising at the entrance, sanitising the rooms after usage, wearing masks etc.

The health officials came fully dressed in PPE-Personal Protection Equipment and gloves as a safety measure with disposal swab collection equipment. They collected swab samples from nose and throat. The samples were collected from the housekeeping staff as well as the office staff. Some preferred the RAPID test and the immediate report turned out to be negative. As a extra safety initiative, they also underwent the next level testing.

Though initially people were apprehensive of giving samples because of the uneasiness and the pain involved in giving samples, many volunteered and made the camp successful. The reports came in after 2 days and huge sense of relief was seen when they were handed their respective negative reports.

It was a good initiative by the college towards protecting individual and institution as a whole.




#### Report on Traffic Awareness Program

# REPORT ON INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY- 8<sup>th</sup> MARCH CELEBRATED ON 13<sup>TH</sup> MARCH, 2021 – THEME "CHOOSE TO CHALLENGE" Report for Academic year 2020-2021

The history of International Women's Day stretches back more than 100 years, when the day was first observed across Europe and America. But according to NPR, it wasn't until March 8, 1946, that feminists in Italy chose the mimosa flower as a symbol of strength, sensibility and sensitivity for Women's Day. Women all over the world want and demand an inclusive future free of stigma, stereotypes, and violence; a future that is prosperous, peaceful, and offers everyone equal rights and opportunities. Women must be represented at the table where decisions are made in order to achieve this goal.

The theme for this year's International Women's Day, "Women in Leadership: Achieving an Equal Future in a COVID-19 World," honours the tremendous efforts made by women and girls around the world in shaping a more equal future and recovering from the COVID-19 pandemic, while also highlighting the gaps that remain.

We see positive outcomes when women take the lead. Women led some of the most effective and exemplary responses to the COVID-19 pandemic. Women, particularly young women, are at the forefront of diverse and inclusive movements for social justice, climate change, and equality in all parts of the world, both online and on the streets. Despite this, women under the age of 30 make up less than 1% of parliamentarians worldwide.

Everyone gains from women's full and effective participation and leadership in all facets of life. Women are still underrepresented in public life and decision-making, according to a recent report by the UN Secretary-General, only 24.9 % of national parliamentarians are women, and women are heads of state or government in 22 countries. Gender equality among national leaders will take another 130 years at the current rate of progress.

Women are also at the forefront of the fight against COVID-19, operating as front-line and health-care workers, scientists, doctors, and caregivers, but they are paid 11% less than their

male counterparts globally. As per the analysis only 3.5 % of COVID-19 task teams from 87 countries had gender parity.

Purple - justice and dignity, Green - hope and White - purity is the official colour of International Women's Day, which began more than a century ago with a march in New York City by 15,000 women demanding better working conditions and voting rights.

On March 13th, 2021, the IQAC Coordinator – Ms. B. Rammya organized a special programme to commemorate International Women's Day. The programme started with the welcome speech by Ms. B. Rammya and continued with simple quiz for all ladies of teaching faculty and non-teaching staff. All the participants were dressed in combination of Orange colour indicating energy, cheerfulness and self-reliant or independent women.

**Quiz** was in three round, first round consists of riddles, second round was identification of person by viewing eyes of that person and third round was identification of previous women achievers by viewing the photos.

Totally 18 ladies participated in the quiz, Dr. B.N. Sathya Bhama won the I place, Ms. Madhuri Patil and Ms. Meera won the II place and Ms. Arpitha won the III place. Dr. Sreelatha, principal of VET Polytechnic delivered a motivational speech, followed by Dr. R. Parvathi, Principal and Director speech which heightened the spirits of all ladies' present. Both speakers praised women's social, economic, cultural, and political accomplishments in recent decades, and said the day serves as a reminder of their responsibility to achieve gender equality.

Another activity – Pick & identify the strength was introduced by Ms. B. Rammya where each participant had to pick one chit with the name of faculty / staff and elaborately identify and tell the strength of that person. This activity made each participant proud of themselves and feel an asset to the organization. This activity highlighted the team unity of the college.

Social distance and wearing mask were maintained during the programme as per the Government norms by all the participants and organizer.
