REPORT ON "CAMPAIGN ON COVID-19 VACCINATION"

The coronavirus pandemic has taken the whole world by storm. While people are caught up in the fear of contracting the virus and led to severe disruptions and widespread confusion among people. The consumer behaviour in India and across the world also changed rapidly over the course of the crisis.

India reported 217,353 coronavirus disease (Covid-19) cases on Friday, the highest single-day spike so far since the pandemic broke out, according to MoHFW. The single-day spike comes a day after 200,739 Covid-19 cases were recorded on Thursday. With this, India's Covid tally has shot up to 14,291,917 cases. Last week India replaced Brazil as the 2nd worst-hit nation in terms of total Covid-19 cases, now it has the second highest active cases too. India also witnessed 1,183 fatalities due to covid-19 in a single day. The death toll from the deadly infection stands at 174,335.

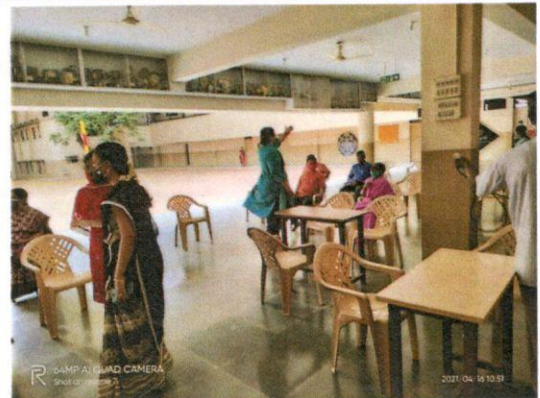
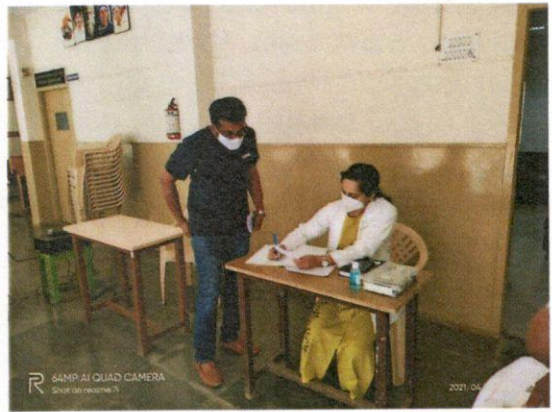
With more cases being reported from schools and colleges, focus is on vaccinating as many staff as possible. Many schools and colleges, with the help of health department and NGOs, are organizing various vaccine camps.

Dr.R.Parvathi, principal & academic director, of VET FGC COLLEGE, said that she is planning to organize a camp in the campus. "Not only we have thought of organizing the vaccine camp for our teaching and non-teaching staff, but also have made it open for the family members of the staffs and other sister institutions."

According to her, the college would be organizing a camp on April 17, from 9am to 2pm for the staffs above 45years of age. "With an Aadhar card, staff can walk in and get vaccinated," she also added. The circular was sent and around 45 members enrolled themselves to get vaccinated.

The camp was organised as per the plan on 17th April at 10.30am till 2.00p.m in association with BBMP Health Care Centre, J.P.Nagar in VET campus, where the

members were seated in social distancing. The details of each member were collected one by one and then they were tested by Dr. Anitha T.N, BBMP J.P.Nagar, and only then they were sent for the vaccination. Covishield vaccination was given and then they were kept on observation for half an hour. The members who had not had their breakfast were given refreshment before the vaccination. The doctor gave instructions to the vaccinated people to avoid non vegetarian food and oily foods for one week. She also said that everyone has to follow the norms of the pandemic. The campaign was a great success and the principal also stated that she will try to organize the campaign again for the second dosage. The staffs and all the members were very happy and thanked the principal for the step taken by her to improve the health of the organization and the surroundings.

The VET First Grade college as an IQAC initiative and as part of Health Committee of the college initiated the COVID 19 testing camp for the staff of the college in view of the rising cases of the Pandemic. This camp was conducted in association with the Health wing of the BBMP. This is the first offline programme at VET First Grade College in the light of the existing continuing Pandemic


In view of fast spread of the virus and in view to ensure safety and security of all staff and students, this drive was conducted. The college has taken all necessary precautions and SOP - Standard Operating Procedures when it was reopened after the lockdown. The precautions taken include the thermal scanning at the entrance and in view of the pandemic, only the main entrance is been kept open, sanitising at the entrance, sanitising the rooms after usage, wearing masks etc.

The health officials came fully dressed in PPE-Personal Protection Equipment and gloves as a safety measure with disposal swab collection equipment. They collected swab samples from nose and throat. The samples were collected from the housekeeping staff as well as the office staff. Some preferred the RAPID test and the immediate report turned out to be negative. As a extra safety initiative, they also underwent the next level testing.

Though initially people were apprehensive of giving samples because of the uneasiness and the pain involved in giving samples, many volunteered and made the camp successful. The reports came in after 2 days and huge sense of relief was seen when they were handed their respective negative reports.

It was a good initiative by the college towards protecting individual and institution as a whole.
