




Program your son / daughter / ward is studying










Importance is given to NSS sports and cultural activities













Degree you completed at VET FGC 45 responses






Admission procedure of the institution

45 responses





Fees structure and environment in the institution 45 responses





Infrastructure and other facilities in the institution 45 responses





Faculty and teaching and learning methodology in the institution 45 responses





Project guidance and industrial visit-Experiential Learning provided by the institution






Training, placements and career guidance 45 responses


Library and E-books



Relevance of Curriculum to Corporate in contemporary world 45 responses






Additional skills imparted through short term and value added courses are 45 responses









STUDENT FEEDBACK ON CURRICULUM ANALYSIS - 2023-24








Periodical updating of syllabus are in tune with the recent trends in the field concerned 324 responses



Emphasis on experimental learning practical project internship in course content 324 responses





Relevance of the textbook and reference books in the curriculum 321 responses





Inclusion of value-based education in the syllabus 324 responses






Periodical assessment of performance through test assignments and seminars 324 responses








SSS - STUDENT SATISFACTION SURVEY - 2023-24



semester 326 responses




The above pie chart represents that 36.8% belong to I years, 35.3% belong to II year and 27.9% belong to III year. This shows that all the three years have given their feedback.

How much of the syllabus was covered in class 326 responses





How well teachers prepare for the classes 326 responses





How well were the teachers able to communicate? 326 responses





The teacher's approach to teaching can best be described as 326 responses






Was your performance in assignments discussed with you?











The teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications. 326 responses





































Professors are encouraged to carry out the research activities 26 responses












